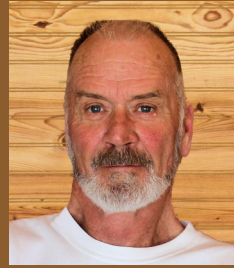

We are doing a survey on which areas members are using. Please fill out & return by March 1st. I will email out the results.

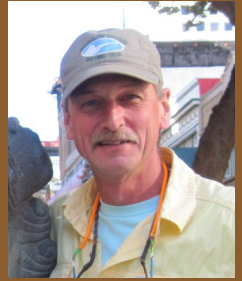
