2018 Club Highlights

President's Message

2018 has been awesome for Lakeshore Conservation Club members, guests, business partners, and the Brainerd Lakes Area.

The Lakeshore Conservation Club's safety record is second to none. Our club did not have a single event. Not one! with thousands of rounds sent down range. When we say that we provide a safe and comfortable place for firearm users, We mean it.

Our membership is 500 strong. Our rifle range and handgun ranges had over 1000 shooters this year.

Once again, we hosted the Brainerd, Pequot and Pillager High School Clay Bird Teams. We (LCC membership) also bought all of the clay birds for these high school teams. LCC also hosted the Minnesota High School Rodeo Association, Turn in Poachers (TIP) Youth Expo, Teach-a-Kid to Shoot, 4-H Shooting Sports, Boy Scouts of America, and the Central Lakes Area College Trap Team. I am sure there are other events that I have forgotten. What an incredible opportunity to expose the area youth to outdoor recreation.

LCC installed \$22,000 dollars of new concrete sidewalks at the clubhouse this year. We were able to get this accomplished through Minnesota Department of Natural Resource matching grants. The sidewalks were installed to give easier access to trap house shooting stations and 5-stand stations for those with physical disabilities. With the sidewalks installed, LCC is planning to host a Disabled Veteran fun shoot during the summer of 2019.

Other accomplishments were the pouring of concrete at the handgun range as well as pouring concrete for the 5-stand shooting stations. We also were able to expand club house parking area.

The LCC Board of Directors worked very hard this year. LCC had an opportunity to acquire a 500-acre parcel of land. The Board hoped to develop the land into a regional trap shooting facility and long range rifle ranges. We worked with several government agencies through out the year. In the end, not everyone from outside LCC shared our enthusiasm and vision. The Board will continue to be wise with the members monies.

In 2019 we will be pricing out a thirty-foot addition to our storage garage as well as installing concrete sidewalks and shooting station pads at the skeet range. This concrete will allow everyone access to the skeet range. The skeet houses will have new exterior siding and trim. We also will be requesting bids to paint the clubhouse.

I want to thank each and every volunteer. There are many, and more are needed. Please consider being a volunteer at the Lakeshore Conservation Club. Please support our only fundraiser, the Wild Game Dinner & Fundraiser. You do not need to be present to win the raffle ticket prizes.

Thanks for being a member and I look forward to seeing you at the range.
